Port Community Church VOLUNTEER CODE OF CONDUCT

Children, youth and vulnerable adults are important gifts entrusted to us by God. I recognize my first obligation is to be a good example of charity, kindness, and integrity to those I serve. As a volunteer, I promise to strictly follow the rules and guidelines in this Volunteer Code of Conduct as a condition of my providing services to children, youth, or vulnerable adults.

VOLUNTEERS SHALL

- 1. Understand that the only appropriate relationship as a volunteer is that of an adult volunteer/minister, not friend or peer to a child or youth.
- 2. Establish and maintain safe environments by preserving appropriate boundaries with children, youth, and vulnerable adults.
- 3. Witness in all relationships the chastity appropriate to one's state in life, whether married or single.
- 4. Treat each person with respect, charity, patience, courtesy, and dignity.
- 5. Immediately report any suspected abuse to the **staff person** in charge (immediate supervisor or pastor).
- 6. Cooperate in any investigation of suspected abuse of children, youth, or vulnerable adults.
- 7. Be familiar with and follow pertinent safety policies, including but not limited to PCC's Safe Church Plan.
- 8. Participate in appropriate training as required by supervisor.
- 9. Work in pairs or as part of a team when working with children, youth, and vulnerable adults.
- 10. Utilize a "buddy system" with children, youth, or vulnerable adults so that children, youth, and vulnerable adults are not alone with adult volunteers at church activities.
- 11. Maintain sleeping quarters for adults separate from children/youth/vulnerable adults when in a retreat setting. (Never share a bed with a child, youth, or vulnerable adult.)
- 12. Use only communications technologies that are "one-to-many" when working with children, youth, or vulnerable adults. Forbidden one-on-one contact includes, but is not limited to, cell phones, social networking sites and their internal private messaging tools (inbox), text messaging, instant messaging, chat, and email. When responding to a personal message, copy your response to your immediate supervisor.
- 13. Meet with children, youth, or vulnerable adults in public places or on church property.
- 14. Use the internet as a resource for programs, but not access, download, or share obscene or inappropriate material, chain letters, jokes, etc. with children, youth, or vulnerable adults.
- 15. Use positive reinforcement with children, youth, or vulnerable adults.
- 16. Employ appropriate conduct, speech, and dress.

VOLUNTEERS SHALL NOT

- 17. Use, possess, or be under the influence of alcohol and/or illegal drugs while responsible for children, youth, or vulnerable adults at any church activity or event.
- 18. Smoke or use tobacco products or vape in the presence of children or youth.
- 19. Engage in sexual harassment of a child, youth, or vulnerable adult.

- 20. Strike, spank, shake, or slap a child, youth, or vulnerable adult.
- 21. Humiliate, ridicule, or degrade a child, youth, or vulnerable adult.
- 22. Touch a child, youth, or vulnerable adult in a sexual manner.
- 23. Expose a child, youth, or vulnerable adult to pornographic or obscene material in any format.
- 24. Use profanity in the presence of a child, youth, or vulnerable adult.
- 25. Use any form of discipline that humiliates a child, youth, or vulnerable adult.
- 26. Host in their homes children, youth, or vulnerable adults whom they have met through their volunteer activities.
